Must...	Spellings	Spellings will be tested every Friday and new spellings given.
	Reading	Read for at least 5 minutes daily and update your reading record-signed by an adult.
	Times tables	Practise your times tables on Times Tables Rock Stars at least 5 minutes per day.
	Mental Maths/Maths	Complete the given weekly maths task and return to school no later than Wednesday of the following week.
Would be good if...	Maths	Can you create a poster explaining the rules of multiplying by 10 and 100 and dividing by 10 and 100? What steps should someone follow to be able to get the right answer?
	English	Create a visitor's guide to Stonehenge. Research and collect information about Stonehenge then present your findings as an information guide for someone who has never been before.
	Science	Have a go at changing the states of solids o liquids using different temperatures. You could use a variety of solids. Summarise your findings and observations.
Would be great if...	Art/History	Can you design and make a Stone Age hut that you would like to live in? Remember, your hut will have to be designed as if it were made during the Stone Age period, so no electricity. Create a design sheet first to explain how you will make each section then have a go at making the hut.
	Geography	Research and produce a fact sheet about Skara Brae. What is it? Where is it? How do we know it is linked to the Stone Age? What is there? What was it used for?
