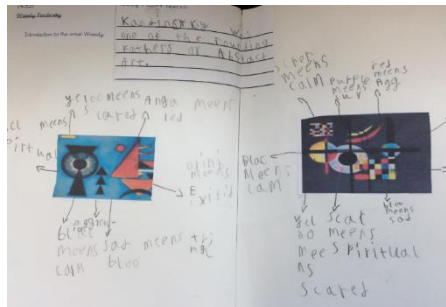


Arts Week - International Artists 24th - 28th May 2021

This week has been an exciting week for the arts with our Arts Week. We have been focussing on international artists which has helped to reinforce and promote cultural diversity. In Arts Week, each year group focussed on different international artists which included Wassily Kandinsky, Georges Seurat, Vincent Van Gogh, Andy Warhol and Frida Kahlo. During the week, all children were given the opportunity to take part in a wide range of activities and learn new skills. Numerous creative experiences were provided, which we hope will boost confidence and self-esteem, develop language and social skills, inspire interests, uncover talents, and ignite enthusiasm for The Arts.

Year 1 - Wassily Kandinsky

Year 1 were inspired by the artist Wassily Kandinsky. The children explored colouring mixing using water paints, printing and painting to support them in making their final pieces.



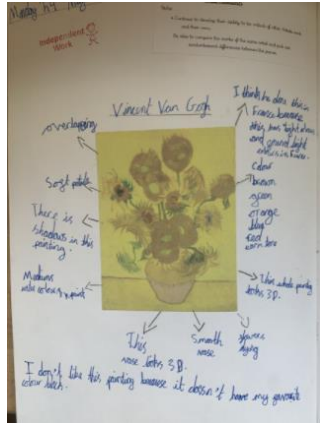
Year 2 - Georges Seurat

Year 2 were inspired by the artist Georges Seurat. The children explored colouring mixing using pencils, they used a variety of mediums such as corks, bottle tops and paint brushes to create dots and dashes and then the children used a combination of skills taught during the week to create their final pi



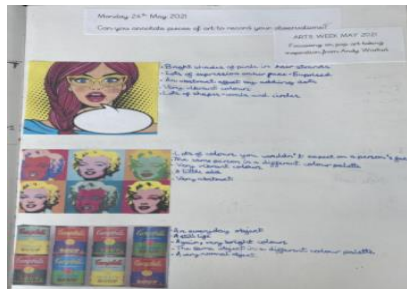
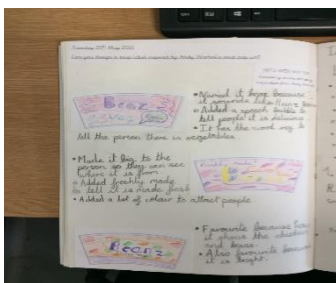
Year 3 - Vincent Van Gogh

Year 3 were inspired by the artist Vincent Van Gogh. The children developed their observational drawing skills and used water paints to create different shades of the same colours.



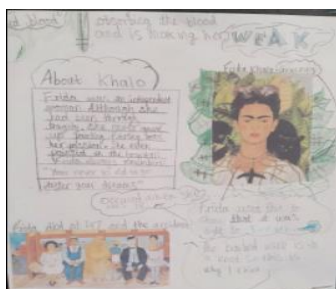
Year 4 - Andy Warhol

Year 4 were inspired by the artist Andy Warhol. The children explored digital art by editing photographs of themselves, moulded clay to make their desired piece and then designed a label for a soup can.



Year 5 - Frida Kahlo

Year 5 were inspired by the artist Frida Kahlo. The children practised drawing different facial features and then used mirrors to help them recreate their own features for their final piece.



Year 6 - Banksy

Year 5 were inspired by the artist Banksy. They used digital art to create and edit graffiti whilst experimenting with a variety of tones, colours and designs. The children then created their final pieces by tracing over a photo of themselves onto their chosen background.
