What is a refugee?

What is an asylum seeker?

A **refugee** is a person who has been forced to leave their country to escape war, persecution or natural disaster. A refugee is someone who has got permission to stay in another country because, if they return to their home country, they will be in great danger

An **asylum seeker** is someone who has asked to be allowed to stay in another country because they have had to flee from danger in their own country.





Refugees and asylum seekers are people who have been forced to leave their homes and their county (and often their families too). They cannot take much with them. Imagine what belongings you would take if you had to grab a bag and leave home at very short notice.
