A monarch is a king or queen.

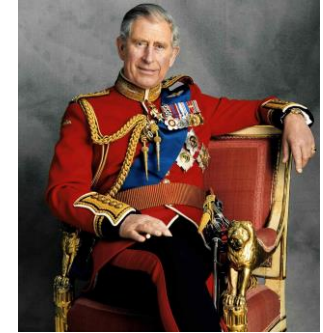
<u>Key Vocabulary</u>	<u>Definition</u>

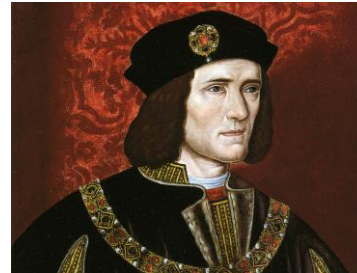
