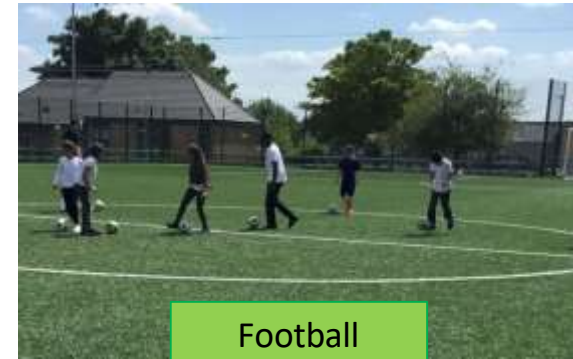


Extra-curricular Clubs

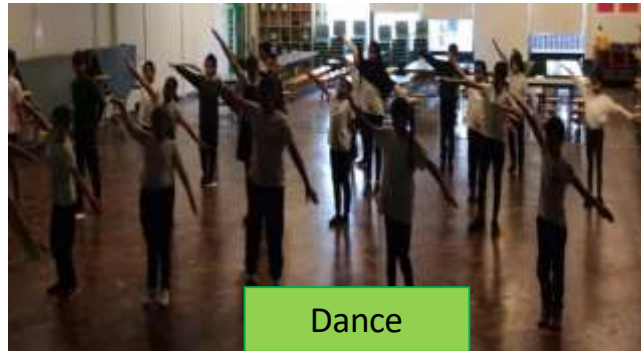

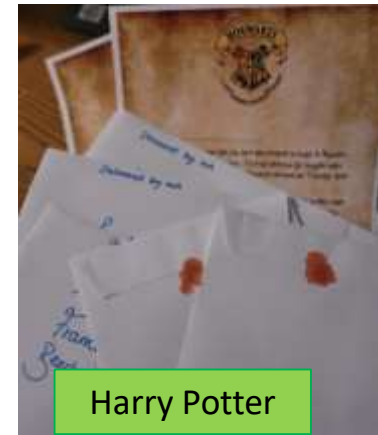

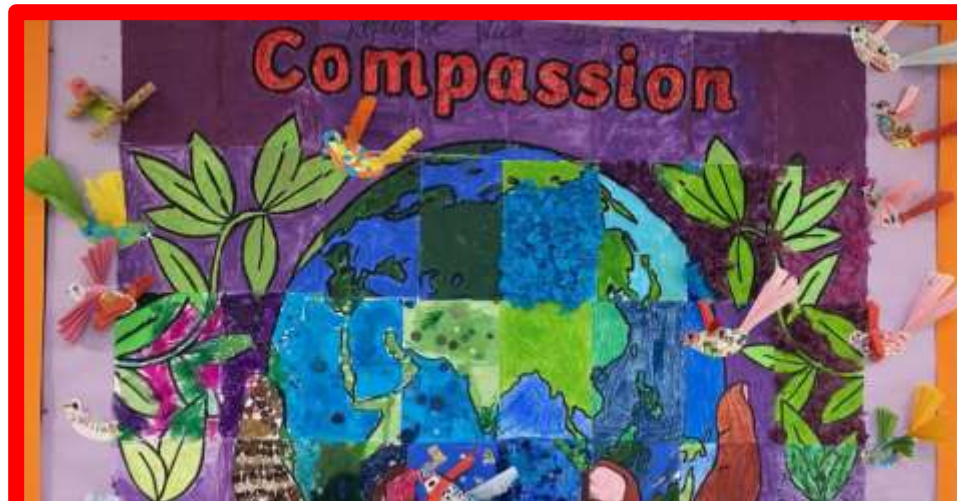
