The Giant's Causeway.

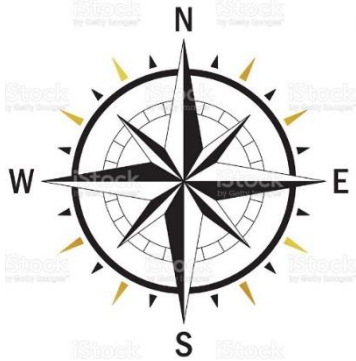


Scotland

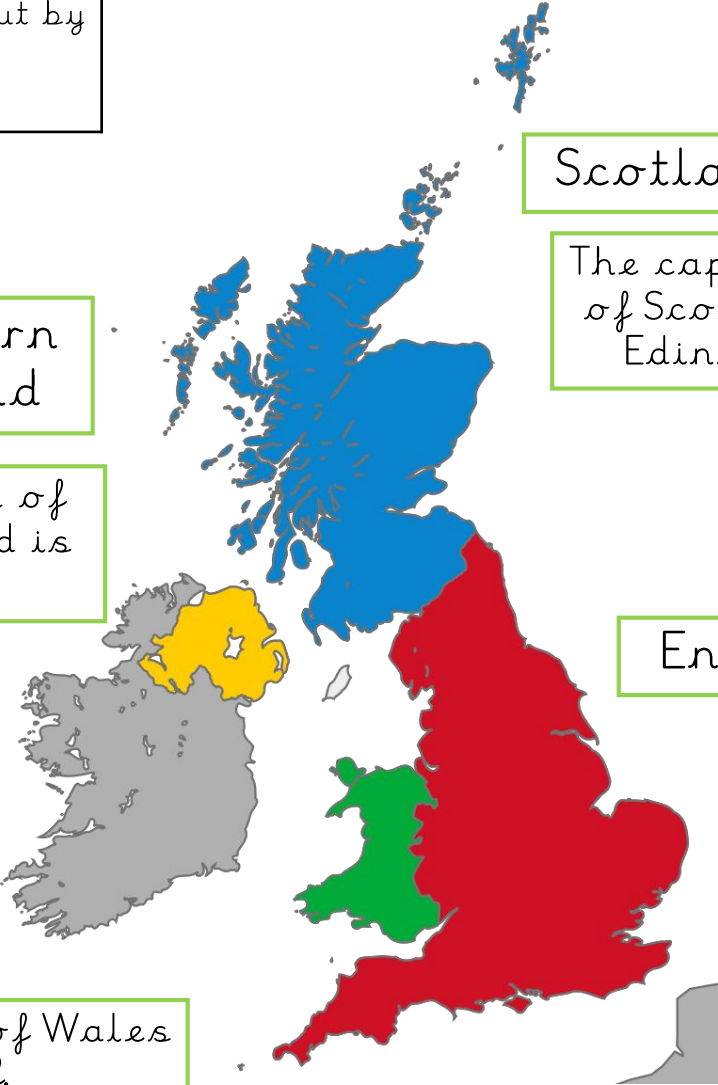
The capital city of Wales is Cardiff.
