Who it's for

- Autistic children and young people aged 5-25 who attend an educational setting
- The children and young people need to be on SEN Support or have an EHC Plan

Why it's offered

 To provide support in line with the Equality Act 2010, Children and Families Act 2014 and the SEND Code of Practice 2015





What we do

 We're a needs-led advisory service that offers support to mainstream schools and colleges to meet the needs of autistic children and young people through time-limited 'Episodes of Care' that may include; observations, advice, resources, contributions to meetings and assessments, targeted interventions and training

How

- **Referral:** They can only be made from **schools and settings**.
- They must be made once the setting has given sufficient time to effectively implement and evidence a comprehensive Universal and Targeted Support Offer and the needs require Specialist Support
- Forms: Specialist Inclusion Team referral form and the submission of the Autism Diagnostic Assessment Report. Parental consent must be given prior to submission
- **Triage:** The referral will be triaged to determine if the Autism Outreach Team are able to be involved
- If involved, an Outreach Teacher will be allocated and do an initial assessment
