- We use observational and functional vision and hearing assessments to understand their needs

Children and young people with a vision or multisensory impairment in education from 0 to 25

Where it's offered

- In the child or young person's home
- In early years settings, schools and colleges

Why it's offered

 To provide support in line with the Equality Act 2010, SEND Code of Practice (2015) and supported by NATSIP guidance the Curriculum Framework for Vision Impairment

How

- **Referral:** are made from health, education providers and parent carers
- **Initial contact:** Referrals are triaged and the team will make contact with parent carers and settings
- **Support:** A package of support is agreed through multi-agency approach
- Review: Support is reviewed continually through the graduated approach
- Parent carers are involved in all aspects of the work
